DRESS CODE

FOR MEN

- **Golf Season (April through October):** Smart-Casual attire is allowed for members and guests participating in athletic activities, which is defined as dress and khaki slacks and Bermuda shorts, tasteful jeans, shirts with collars, mock turtlenecks, sweaters, dress shoes and loafers. Shirts must be buttoned and tucked in, and all hats and caps must be removed when inside the clubhouse.
- **Not Permitted:** T-shirts, flip-flops, cargo shorts, collared shirts open more than one button, or untucked shirts.

FOR WOMEN

- **Golf Season (April through October):** Smart-Casual attire is allowed for members and guests participating in athletic activities, which is defined as dress and khaki slacks and Bermuda shorts, tasteful jeans, shirts with collars, mock turtlenecks, sweaters, dress shoes and loafers. Shirts must be buttoned and tucked in, and all hats and caps must be removed when inside the clubhouse.
- **Not Permitted:** Spandex, open midribs, shorts, leggings, extremely short hemlines (not more than 3" above the knee), t-shirts, swim cover-ups, cargo shorts or flip-flops.
